ESHER & DISTRICT RACING PIGEON CLUB

The Young Bird Pigeon Racing commenced at the beginning of August with the first race from Blandford, a distance between 83 and 87 miles. Young Birds are those actually born in the current year from the 1st January and are up to six months old at commencement of racing. Esher Club members have again been successful in the Federation. Paul Arnold won the first race taking 12th Federation at an average speed of 1837ypm, 63 mph. Slight & Taylor took 4th Federation from Wincanton, another fast race at 1726vpm almost 59mph. The third race from Yeovil had Malik & Khan in 2nd position. Followed by an even faster race at 1923ypm, over 65mph, back to Blandford for the second half of the season with Malik & Khan in first position and Slight & Taylor close behind in second position. A slightly harder race at 1296ypm.

On the 31st August the birds were at Taunton and despite adverse wind conditions Colin Crook and partner, Andy Iddenden, finished in 2nd Federation with a velocity of 1518ypm.

With just two races left, Esher Club are the top Federation Club with a lead of just three points. Good luck to members for the final two races. Our Sponsorship races are also drawing to a close, these are the races where non-pigeon flyers sponsor birds throughout the Young Bird Season. Birds are selected by members of the Sports & Social Club in March/April when birds have been weaned off. A Sponsorship fee of £20 is given and the total prize money competed for is £500.
