

The club points total will exceed 180, not bad when the maximum points each race is 10 points for the winning club, 9 for the second, down to 1 point for the 10th club.

In one race the Esher Club recorded 17 positions in the Top 25 from 1693 pigeons. Congratulations to all members.

The final race from Yelverton on the 13th September will provide £200 prize money to be shared between the first three home. Good luck to all. 16 birds remaining from the original 22 birds selected.
