Member Roger Brown sourced a 750 Formula racing car based on a 1930 Austin 7 Saloon. It was built by Graham Curry in 1957-8 with success at Silverstone, Oulton Park and Brands Hatch. Thanks go to Graham for the loan of this car, and to the many club members who laboured before, during and after the event to set up and strike the display.

Enter 'THE STIG', in cardboard cut-out guise, to stand alongside children who wished to sit in the Austin race car on a mock starting grid, complete with helmet and goggles, and have their photos taken by adoring parents and bystanders, for a small donation to Macmillan.

Suffice to say that there was great interest in the car display, the car boot sales and the photo opportunity although we were disappointed that no parents or guardians elected to have their pictures taken in the set-up. However some £270 was raised
