Eileen presented Julie and Paul with a cheque for £2,650.60.

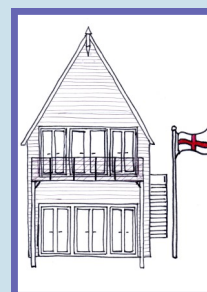

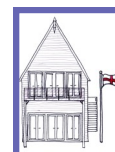

Ken Besant Memorial Trophy for best pigeon of the year - Malik & Khan.

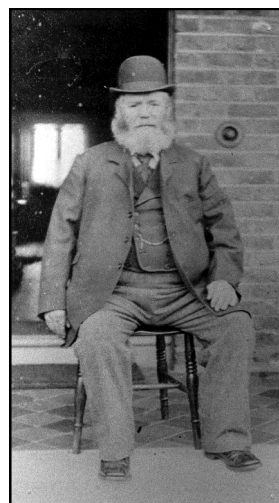
