Since I wrote in the last edition of the Village News everything on the football front has now thankfully slowed down to a snail's pace. The players are all on their Summer breaks and enjoying the rest from the rigorous training sessions and matches, the goals have been stored and all the kit has been put into mothballs until the season kicks off again in September.

Although, for me personally as club Secretary the season has already started, considerable paperwork has to be completed for the respective leagues and also for Surrey FA, all this various paperwork has to be submitted by certain dates so that we can ensure that competitive football is played at West End next season 2013/2014.

As for the individual Westend teams, the Saturday side finished in 3rd place in the league and narrowly missed out on an automatic promotion place, although, looking at the points difference between us and the next team in the league there was a massive 17 points difference. This has been a remarkable season for the Saturday team and all the players and Management Team can be proud of what they have achieved for the club.

As stated in my last report, the Sunday side had a storming finish to the season, they had spent most of it by languishing in last place in the league, things didn't



look so good and there was a serious prospect of relegation threatening, however, since Christmas and New Year they have only lost 1 game and managed to haul themselves from bottom spot up to a respectable mid table position to ensure that we will be playing in Division 2 next season.

A couple of interesting pieces of news for the club at the time of writing and some really fantastic news.

Firstly, I have been informed by the Kingston & District Football League that they have decided to promote the Saturday team to the Premier Division for next season so we will be back playing our football at the highest level, once again, congratulations all round to the players and Management Team for what has been a superb season and this decision by the league is certainly the icing on the cake.

Secondly, on the 23rd April 2013 AFC Westend were awarded the prestigious accolade of an official Charter Standard Football Club by the FA, this award doesn't come lightly so we as a club have to be congratulated on obtaining this worthy accolade. This now means that the Senior Section and AFC Westend Youth have both obtained the status of official Charter Standard Clubs.

ESHER & DISTRICT RACING PIGEON CLUB

With an increased membership and the prospect of high birdage the Old Bird Racing Season was looked forward to with great anticipation. Unfortunately, the poor weather conditions at the beginning of April which delayed the onset of Spring caused numerous complications. For the first time in living memory the two opening races had to be cancelled. Breeding and pre-season training were delayed which meant that most lofts were not ready in time. We eventually got going on the 20th April and I am pleased to say that Esher members were again highly placed in the Federation although the actual total birdage entries were greatly reduced from 2012 totals.

We raced from Alencon in France, a distance of approximately 205 miles for our 5th Race. This proved to be a very difficult race with strong westerly winds in the Channel blowing many birds off course and there were a few losses. Our two youngest members Tyrone and Fabian Buggy won their first ever race in the Club, a tremendous performance. Paul Arnold won his first race with our Club from Newton Abbott a distance of 157 miles.

Slight and Taylor won our most recent race from Taunton recording an average speed of 77 miles per hour, 126 miles in 96 minutes.

Our Channel Race programme has been reduced with Yelverton and Truro Race points being substituted,. We will, however, still be holding our longest race from Bergerac abut 454 miles in mid-July. Young Bird Racing commences in August. Sponsorship birds will be competing for prize money in excess of £500. Good luck to all.
