The racing season started in early April with the initial Pigeon Sale of young birds being sponsored for the forthcoming season. All pigeons were

sponsored by non-pigeon fanciers from West End Village and the Village Club. This year all birds were taken and it was necessary for the Palmer Lofts to quickly breed a few more for those who missed out. All in all close on thirty birds were sponsored, hopefully to participate in the first race in August.

The real racing for Old Birds started on the 11th April, and our oldest member Jim Rookledge took the honours, not only with first position, but also winning the Federation from 1314 pigeons, recording the velocity of 1866 yards per minute, 64 miles per hour from Blandford some 86 miles.

Our members Malik and Khan went one better the following week taking 1st and 2nd both in Club and Federation with Bob Carter and Malik again completing Esher recording the first six home of 1444 pigeons. Bob Carter took 1st and 2nd in the next race and 3rd/4th in the Federation from Yeovil, 107 miles.

Further results were Honiton 130 miles with Chris Slight clocking two together, recording 2022 yards per minute, just under 70 miles per hour. The next race was from Falaise, our first cross-channel race won by Khan brothers, completing 172 miles in 3hours 25 minutes, velocity 1475ypm.

Vic Emberson brought Esher top from Exeter taking first two in Esher and Federation. Vire was our next Channel race won by Malik and Khan, taking 1st/2nd in the Club and 2nd/3rd in the Federation.

Honiton proved to be a success for Esher once more, Colin Crook and Andy Iddenden taking the 1st two in Club and Federation; velocity 1903ypm.

In June we were at Fougeres, our worst performance in the Federation, but Slight and Taylor our Channel specialists take 1st and 3rd in the Club. At Yelverton, Bob Carter was on top again in yet another wind-assisted race recording 1819ypm.

On 20th June the Club had its longest Channel race from Messac and once again the Slight and Taylor partnership took the honours taking 1st and 2nd, recording a velocity of 1202ypm over 257 miles and finished 5th in the Federation.

That is our season to-date with three old bird races left and then the excitement of young bird racing commences on the 1st August.
