

ESHER & DISTRICT RACING PIGEON CLUB

Esher Pigeon Club quickly got into action with their birds for the Old Bird Season and by the second race were in equal 1st position storming into the lead by Race 3 and not headed again until the end, when members led by some 19 points from the next club.

Best results were from Bob Carter and son, leading the individual placings by 39 points from Vic Emberson of Esher at 29 points, with Paul Arnold of Esher just behind.

The hardest race was from Alencon just over 203 miles. Esher members took first three positions in The Federation with Allen Palmer 1st, recording 822ypm, 7 hrs 15 mins fly. Norman Brothers 7 hrs 24mins 795 ypm, and Khan Bros 7 hrs 50mins 792 ypm. This race caused an initial loss of 500 birds from 575 sent and although many have subsequently made it home, the following race numbers were greatly reduced causing the cancellation of some races.

More bad news for the racing fraternity and local participants in the Palmer lofts Annual Young Bird Races: of the initial batch of 30 birds some 16 were lost to the local hawks residing between Hawkshill Way and Claremont. Some 14 were killed outright and a further two badly injured. Regrettably this years racing was cancelled. Hopefully we will have better luck in the 2017 season. Normal Young Bird competitions will continue for August into September. Watch this space for future results.

The Reserve side also won our first piece of silverware for the club by winning the Intermediate Cup Final by 2-1 against a very strong Deepcut Community side. Since the last Village Newsletter the motor section has not just been drinking beer in the club on Thursday evenings. We went on a Cobweb Run at the beginning of April to the Bombay Sapphire distillery near Whitchurch in Hampshire. It



was a fine bright day, and after a very well presented tour of the premises and sampling the product (non-alcoholic cocktails for the drivers) we retired to the Watership Down pub just along the road for lunch before returning home.

I entered my car plus Ken as bouncer for the Cobham trial on April 24th. It was well organised on a dry bright day by the Brooklands section of the 750 Motor Club. Bob Thompson also took part with Ben bouncing and did well finishing 2nd in a class with 8 entries. Ken and I finished 14th in a class with 22 entries. June 19th DVW and I took part in the A7OC's Bewl Water Rally near Lamberhurst in Kent (remember Ken's Grand Day Out in 2013 to the same location near Tunbridge Wells), over 60 miles each way accomplished without problems. June 25th we went on the BEN Windsor Great Park Rally in aid of the Motor Industry Benevolent Fund. This is a small event with the rally route taking us through parts of the Park not normally open to the public. July 3rd, with a friend, we went to the 750 Motor Club National Rally at Beaulieu, over 80 miles each way.
