Bryan was a joint founder of the Motor Club section of the Village Sports and Social Club, together with Charles Pocklington. Between them they bought and began restoration of an Austin 7 Chummy. We shall now join Bryan's name with that of Charles on our annual charity rally planned for this coming September in the Peak District.

Bryan was also the first Chairman of the Sports and Social Club when it was revived from closure in the early 1990s and he and Alice were huge supporters of both the Club, the village community in general and their favourite personal charity for Meningitis. He was one of nature's gentlemen and will be sorely missed by everyone.

Our current activities, apart from private holidays, centre on the coming Bank Holiday Flower Show on August 26th when we shall hold our biennial car display on the green and hope to have a few other interesting attractions such as car boot sales and other engineering items. 
We have still room for another car on our Pocklington Classic rally, as mentioned above.

Early in his career, Charles was Art Editor of Eagle, the boys comic. Some of you may remember reading about the adventures of Dan Dare, Space Pilot and his arch enemy the Green Mekon! Charles was asked to be the launching Art Editor of Car Magazine in the early 1960s—a dream job for him as his hobby always involved cars and he was building an Austin 7 Special.

Eventually, Charles decided to go freelance. The majority of his clients were within the car industry. He produced magazines and other related artwork and photographed the launch of many new car models.


Upon retiring his big project was the complete rebuild (from a box of bits) of an Austin Seven Chummy, and was fortunate

enough to have the expertise of Bryan Austin to assist him. The Chummy is now owned by Bob Thompson, who with his son, Ben, successfully enter the car in Hill climbs and Driving tests.

There will then be a two week gap before Young Birds bred in 2017 will commence.
