EMBER MANOR LODGE No. 4740 Potted Historical Notes

Ember Manor Lodge 4740, sponsored by Ember Lodge 2540, was consecrated on 25 September 1925 at Mark Masons Hall, Great Queens Street, London by the then Deputy Provincial Grand Master of the Province of Surrey. At that time the Provincial Grand Master for Surrey was His Royal Highness, Edward Prince of Wales, KG and there were 70 Lodges in the Province.

The first regular meeting was held on November 25th 1925 at the Castle Hotel, East Molesey where it continued to meet until the premises were demolished to make way for the new Hampton Court Bridge. The meetings were then held at Thames Hotel before moving to Surbiton Masonic Hall.

In September 1940 it was agreed that meetings would be at the discretion of the Worshipful Master 'owing to nightly air raids, the difficulty of transport and the uncertainty of dates being available'.

In 1967 the Lodge was honoured with a visit from Rt W Bro FTB Wheeler MA the Grand Provincial Master.

October 1975 the Lodge celebrated its Golden Jubilee.

In 2004 after 75 years meeting at Surbiton Masonic Hall the Lodge relocated to West End Esher where it has been for 17 years. Members were required to join the West End Sports and Social Club thus allowing them the use of the Clubhouse bar facilities!

In 2019 the Lodge received the Gold Award in recognition of its donation to the 2019 Festival in favour of the Royal.

Masonic Benevolent Institution hosted by the Province of Surrey.

The Lodge membership now stands at 20 and will be celebrating its Centenary in 2025.

NEWS FROM THE POND

We were delighted when seven swans arrived on the Prince of Wales pond recently. However, we are very sad to report the death of one of them. The carcass was found by Alice Austin whilst walking her dog on the green. It had clearly been attacked and mutilated by another animal, most likely a fox. The Swan Sanctuary was notified but was unaware of the attack. The Elmbridge Commons Rangers were also informed and came to remove the remains. In the current outbreak of Bird Flu it is very important that you **do not** touch wild birds feathers or surfaces contaminated with wild bird droppings. Please read the Government 's Animal & Plant Health Agency guidelines below which have been posted around the village green and ponds. Please heed the warnings given. Angela Stockbridge

DON'T RISK SPREADING BIRD FLU!

Keep to the footpath, with dogs on leads

Do not pick up or touch dead or sick wild birds

Do not touch wild bird feathers or surfaces contaminated with wild

If you keep poultry or other birds, wash your hands, clean and disinfect your footwear before tending to your birds

Please report to the Defra helpline on 03459 335577 if you find:

- A single bird of prey (including owls)
- 3 or more dead wild waterfowl (swans, geese, or ducks) or gulls
 5 or more dead birds of any species


APHA may collect some dead birds for surveillance testing. Otherwise, birds can be disposed of safely, if necessary, by the local authority or landowners







Sun bites and spotty planets

Since the lovely summer weather left us, observing opportunities have been few and far between, and with a partial solar eclipse approaching on 25th October I wasn't optimistic about seeing any of it at all; the usual astronomer's curse often kicks in whenever there is a special event.

However, come the morning of the eclipse the forecast seemed to suggest at least some clear spells in between showers, so I put my solar scope out, under an umbrella at times, and waited for a gap. In the end, I got a number of quite reasonable views up until about 20 mins before the maximum extent of the eclipse, so I was quite happy with that. I managed some quick smartphone snaps of the event which are included here. Interesting elements to note are the two sunspots, and also how you can see the uneven mountainous edge of the Moon silhouetted against the sun.

The major planets are quite well positioned currently, with Jupiter blazing away in the South mid evening, and Mars not far off the same brightness in the East, and high in the South after midnight.

When conditions are good, it is amazing what can been seen on these planets. Mars is currently close to the Earth and right now is showing an interesting feature called Syrtis Major, which appears as a dark area shaped a little like the African continent against the reddish dust covering the rest of the planet. It is also possible to see the extensive ice cap covering the North pole. To me it looks like an earth twin, albeit red and black rather than blue and green.

Jupiter is past its best for the year, but still shows plenty of detail in its weather systems. Two main bands of cloud show clearly, with plenty more to see with careful observation. The Great Red Spot can be seen as an orange red oval when on our side of the planet, and the orbiting moons regularly pass behind and in front of the disc. Every now and then, you get to see the shadows cast by these moons onto the surface of the planet. I managed to capture this with a smartphone, although the view through a scope is so much better than I am able to capture.



That's all for this report, there is always something to see when the weather plays ball. Keep an eye out for Orion the Hunter which will be more and more prominent in the South as winter progresses.

DANISH HONEY CAKE (HONNINGAKE)

One of our most favourite recipes - this has all the undertones of Christmas and hygge. Use three round cake pans (18-cm/7-in. ones), but in our instagram reel we use a large pan 40 x 30 cm and only layer the cake once. Basically, this recipe is adapted to be a one layer bake

but you can make it in 3 pans or as directed below. Quantities are the same - just adapt baking times to suit. Serves 8.

Ingredients

125 ml runny honey 80 ml golden syrup 50 g caster sugar 2 whole eggs and 2 egg yolks 300 g plain flour 1 1/2 teaspoons baking soda

1/2 teaspoon baking powder a pinch of salt 2 teaspoons ground cinnamon

1 teaspoon ground cardamom 1 teaspoon ground ginger

1 teaspoon ground cloves Grated zest from 1 orange

250 ml/1 cup buttermilk

150 ml/2/3 cup double/heavy cream

BUTTERCREAM FILLING

100 g/1/2 cup caster sugar

125 g butter softened

1 egg yolk

1 teaspoon vanilla sugar or seeds from 1/2 vanilla pod

CHOCOLATE GLAZE

40 g butter 100 g dark chocolate 2 tablespoons golden syrup chocolate sprinkles

Instructions

Preheat the oven to 170°C (340°F) Gas 31/2

Line the cake pan (or pans, if making 3 smaller, round ones) with baking parchment (1 large pan 40 x 30 cm)

Over a low heat, combine the honey, golden syrup and sugar with 100 ml water in a saucepan until melted together. Leave to cool until tepid.

Add the eggs (both whole and yolks) to the bowl of a stand mixer and whisk to combine. Slowly add the tepid syrup mixture into the eggs, beating continuously on high speed.

Combine the flour, bicarbonate of/baking soda, baking powder, salt and spices together, then fold into the egg mixture. Add the orange zest, buttermilk and cream and fold until smooth.

Pour batter into each prepared cake pan. Bake in the preheated oven for around 9–11 minutes, or until well risen, golden brown and springy to the touch. A skewer inserted into the middle should come out clean. Leave to cool for a few minutes in the pans, then turn out onto a wire rack and allow to cool completely.

To make the buttercream, make a sugar syrup by gently heating the sugar in a pan with 2 tablespoons water until fully dissolved. Leave to cool a little. Whisk the butter, egg yolk and vanilla together on high speed, then slowly add the sugar syrup, whisking well with each addition. Continue beating for several minutes until creamy and fluffy. If it does not go fluffy, pop the mixture in the fridge for 30-45 minutes, then whip again when slightly cooled (if the butter is too soft, or the sugar too hot, it may not whip properly at first, but it will be fine when a bit colder).

To assemble, place one cake layer on a serving plate, cover generously with the fluffy buttercream, then add the top layer of cake. To make the chocolate glaze, melt the butter, chocolate and syrup in a heatproof bowl set over a pan of hot water. Let it cool ever so slightly. Spread over the top of the cake, scatter over chocolate sprinkles and leave the topping to harden before serving. Enjoy!


